Home Ownership... What's the big deal? I get asked this question every now and then. My son is a senior in high school and hasn't really had to "struggle" thus far in his 18 years. We were having a conversation about home ownership recently that made me reflect on why I am so passionate about what we do. Did you know that the average net worth of a renter is \$5,200 and the average net worth of a homeowner is \$238,400? It is my opinion that owning a home is the first building block to securing your financial future. Sadly, home ownership today is at a record low. Home ownership is becoming harder to achieve because there are fewer and fewer affordable homes available within a commutable distance to good paying jobs. This is partly caused by an increase in labor and material costs as well as an increase in government regulations. To purchase or even rent homes in a

safe area with a good school district is becoming increasingly limited to the privileged few who can afford homes at a higher price range. The schools that rank lowest in our state are not coincidentally in areas of under-privileged lower income. How do well meaning parents help their children get ahead if they are unable to buy a home in these "elite" areas? This is the new challenge. So my son, who is deciding which college to attend, will in 4-6 years (God willing) return to the Savannah or Richmond Hill area to start his career (at the very bottom) and will likely not be able to afford to live in his hometown. Millennials are, on average, renting for more than 10 years and are likely to pay more than \$120,000 in rent before they can afford to buy their first home. As I mentioned earlier, wealth historically begins building with home ownership.

I want the most for my children (as all parents do) and I want the American Dream to be easily accessible to all who wish to achieve it. I work every day towards making the playing field equal for everyone – not just people who fit into a certain price category. While reading this issue of our Dream Home Buyer's Guide, I hope you interpret our magazine as the open invitation to home ownership that it is designed to be. 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
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

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

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The Life and Legacy of David Minning



On July 19, 2017, we lost a beloved member of the Richmond Hill community. After a courageous 15-month battle with a rare form of bile duct cancer, David Minning passed away at the age of 50. David was a loving son, devoted husband, and caring father. He was deeply respected and loved for his dedication to his family, his friends, his community, his church, and his work. In a memorial eulogy a friend said of David; "If you measured Dave's life by the quality within it, he lived to be a very old man." John Mowry, developer of The Commons at Richmond Hill, named a street in his new development Minning Loop - forever honoring his remarkable friend and the tremendous legacy he left behind.

Born in Detroit, Michigan on December 15, 1966, David was the first grandchild on both sides of his family. From an early age it was evident that David was predestined to be a leader. Throughout his life he proved to be a source of inspiration, support and guidance to his siblings, cousins, and friends. His warm personality, sense of humor, and love of life resulted in rich friendships and many fulfilling experiences. He loved spending his free time with friends and his home was a popular gathering spot for socializing, watching sports, and building strong and enduring relationships. A naturally-gifted athlete, David enjoyed playing various sports throughout his life.

In 2000, David married the love of his life, Monica. Over the next few years their happiness was richly increased as they welcomed two sons, Matthew (now 18) and Michael (16). Devoted parents, they concentrated on building a strong and fulfilling life for themselves and their sons.

Whether on the playing field or in the classroom, David's work ethic was tremendous. In 2001, he earned his Bachelor of Science Degree from Central Michigan University and began working full-time in the automotive industry. David had a dream of someday being able to combine his

career with his love of flying, and in 2006 that wish came true. He accepted a job with Gulfstream Aerospace in Savannah and the family relocated to Richmond Hill. While building a distinguished career at Gulfstream, David also earned his

master's degree from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University.

A man of strong faith, Dave and his family began attending Compassion Christian Church (formerly Savannah Christian Church) from the time they moved to Richmond Hill. He loved his church and Bible study group, lived the principles of his beliefs, and took joy in sharing his faith and leading others to the Lord when opportunities were presented.



David also quickly became involved in the South Bryan County Recreation Department soccer program. He began as a coach and then took on additional responsibilities in administrative positions, allowing him to support the program and share his visions for its future. David also served as liaison between the soccer program and the Bryan County Board of Commissioners. He was instrumental in the planning and establishment of DeVaul Henderson Park, a large sports complex. Many of Richmond Hill's soccer players played for "Coach Dave" at one time or another, including his son Matthew. As Matthew developed as a soccer player, David wanted to provide his son with an opportunity to play at a more advanced level. So he and Matthew became part of the Savannah United soccer program. Once again, David contributed by coaching and assisting with administrative needs. Long drives to practices and weekend games in nearby states soon became part of the Minning family schedule, but David's dedication never wavered.

In addition to his support for the soccer programs, David was always very interested in contributing to the advancement of technology in education at Bryan County Schools. He was a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) advocate before the term even existed. With the full support of Gulfstream Aerospace and school administration, he set up stimulating demonstrations on career days, brought in more computers, 3-D printers, and industry-grade computerized engineering design software into the technology program. He also worked on the process of establishing a bridge between schools and local employers. His intent was to build a seamless plan for design and development of specific skill sets needed by employers, allowing graduating students to transition seamlessly into employment. David also collaborated with Richmond Hill Middle School's Principal, Dr. William McGrath, and technology teacher, Mr. John Melcher, in developing and guiding a STEM team at the school. Their efforts were well-rewarded in 2017 when the team was crowned National Champions in the NASA Student Astronaut Challenge at Kennedy Space Center.

After his diagnosis in April 2016, David's faith and consistent testimony were the comfort and strength that carried him, his family, co-workers, and friends through the dark time that loomed on the horizon. It was also during this time that he and his family began to grasp how truly enormous his influential reach had been throughout his life. The community rallied around them, providing support in any way they could.



In March 2017, a tribute night was held before a soccer game at Richmond Hill High School. It had become evident that David would not make it to see his son Matthew's senior walk. So that night, David and his family were able to take an early senior walk with Matthew. Afterward, representatives of Bryan County Board of Commissioners, Bryan County Recreation Association, Savannah United Soccer, Richmond Hill Middle School STEM Program, and the Richmond Hill High School varsity soccer team all detailed David's contributions and expressed their appreciation for his dedication and achievements.

After a large family gathering at Easter, David and his family enjoyed an all-expense-paid luxury vacation in Daytona Beach. The trip was provided by the Jack & Jill Late Stage Cancer Foundation, an organization that funds experiences for families with a terminally-ill parent. After the trip, ten of David's friends from Michigan flew down to spend time with him and enjoy the love and strong bond they had shared through the years.

In the last few weeks of his illness, David had a chance to visit Richmond Hill Middle School and its STEM team. He learned of the team's championship and held the trophy they had been

awarded. Also during this time, Gulfstream held a special luncheon where David was honored as the first recipient of "The Minning," a newly-created award to be given annually to an employee that personifies the traits that made David such an outstanding employee. The award plaque is inscribed with, "In honor of an extraordinary man who taught us that we all play better as a team!" At the June meeting of the Bryan County Board of Commissioners, the Board declared June 13, 2017 to be David Minning Day. Although David was unable to attend, his sons proudly accepted the award on his behalf.

A little over a month later, David Minning went to be with the Lord. His life is a testimony to making the most of every day we are given, setting goals high, and embracing new experiences. One of David's favorite Bible verses, which perfectly exemplifies his life and legacy is, "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another" (Proverbs 27:17). His love of sports is carried on through his sons and the programs he worked so hard to support. Matthew is excelling at soccer and Michael is enjoying playing basketball with South Bryan County Recreation Department.

David's loss is keenly felt by his family and friends as they move forward without him, but they find comfort in knowing that the first words he most likely heard in heaven were "Well done, thou good and faithful servant" (Matthew 25:21).




Fort McAllister State Park



Located on the banks of the Ogeechee River, Fort McAllister State Park is an area steeped in both history and natural beauty. The Park showcases the most well-preserved earthwork fortification of the Confederacy, complete with cannons, a hot shot furnace, bombproof barracks, palisades, as well as a Civil War Museum for visitors to explore. Several programs are offered daily on topics such as the Civil War, soldier life, weapons, wildlife, and crafts. The Park also offers tours and holds special events throughout the year.

Nestled among majestic live oaks and salt marsh, Fort McAllister State Park provides an excellent backdrop for camping, fishing, boating, hiking, picnicking, and much more. Seven cabins sit on stilts near the marsh, surrounded by palm trees and palmettos. The shaded campground is bordered by tidal Redbird Creek, a boat ramp, fishing dock, and nature trail. A large picnic area offers river views and playgrounds, while another boat ramp provides access to the Ogeechee River.



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
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


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
